**Ask your healthcare provider for a simple blood-lead test**

**Lead sources may include:** paint chips, dust, & soil in or around older (pre-1978) buildings • older painted objects • leaded glass, crystal, pewter, & ceramic dishes (more likely in painted china & in pottery from Latin America, the Middle East, & India) • herbal/traditional remedies or cosmetics from other countries • candy from Mexico • toys & trinkets



**There are no safe levels of lead.** Studies have documented neurological effects, speech & hearing problems, hyperactivity, behavior, learning, & other problems with blood-lead levels over 5  $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$

**LET YOUR OB/GYN DOCTOR KNOW IF YOU ARE PREGNANT & YOUR CHILD TESTS POSITIVE FOR LEAD**
